A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Law relating to the Allocation of Gold Duties.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Gold Duties Act, 1903."

Short Title.

10 2. Notwithstanding anything in "The Gold Duties Act Amendment Act, 1882," the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council distribute the gold duty on gold produced in neighbouring boroughs or counties among such boroughs and counties in such proportions as he deems just.

Gold duty may be apportioned between neighbouring local authorities.
