GOLD DUTIES REDUCTION.

ANALYSIS.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to abolish the Export Duty on Gold, by reducing that Title.  
 Duty to One Shilling per Ounce from and after the Thirty-  
 first Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-  
 5 five, and by taking off the remaining duty of One Shilling per  
 Ounce from and after the Thirty-first day of March, One  
 thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in  
 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
 10 follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is “The Gold Duties Reduction Short Title.  
 Act, 1884.”

2. From and after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand Export duty on  
gold reduced.  
 15 eight hundred and eighty-five, the duty levied on the exportation of  
 gold from the Middle Island shall be one shilling per ounce; and  
 from and after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight  
 hundred and eighty-six, no duty shall be payable on the exportation  
 of gold from the Middle Island.

3. If at any time the County Councils and Borough Councils within How Act made  
applicable to North  
Island.  
 20 any mining district in the North Island, which receive the revenues  
 derived from the export of gold from any such district, respectively  
 pass resolutions praying that this Act may be brought into force in  
 such district, and transmit the same to the Governor, he shall, upon  
 25 the receipt of such resolutions, issue a Proclamation declaring that  
 this Act shall come into force in such mining district, and the  
 provisions of this Act shall thereupon in all respects apply to and  
 have full force and effect in such mining district in the North Island.
