This Public Bill originated in the Legislative Council, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the House OF REPRESENTATIVES for its concurrence.

GISBORNE HIGH SCHOOL ACT 1885 AMENDMENT.

[LOCAL BILL.]

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to further enable the Governors of the Gisborne High Title. School to grant Scholarships, and to remove Doubts as to the Power heretofore conferred upon the Governors for the Grant of Scholarships.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Gisborne High School Short Title. 10 Act 1885 Amendment Act, 1904."

2. Section three of "The Gisborne High School Act Amend-Repeal of section 3 of "The Gisborne of "The Gisbor

ment Act, 1893," is hereby repealed.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Gisborne High Amendment Act, School Act, 1885," or any amendment thereof, it shall be lawful for 15 the Governors of the Gisborne High School to appropriate and expend Power to grant in every year such portion of its annual rents and income, accrued scholarships, prizes, exhibitions, or revenues, and mortgages, as they shall see fit, for the grant of scholarships, prizes, exhibitions, or bursaries for proficiency in secondary subjects, or technical manual instruction to pupils who have been or 20 are being educated at any public, primary, secondary, or technical school established under "The Education Act. 1877," or "The

Secondary Schools Act, 1903," or "The Manual and Technical Instruction Act, 1900," in the Borough of Gisborne or in the Counties of Cook and Waiapu, which borough and counties shall, subject to the

25 Board's power to extend, restrict, alter, or vary such special district, constitute "the special district" within the meaning of "The Gisborne High School Act 1885 Amendment Act, 1893."

Scholarships, &c., may be held at any college affiliated to the University of New Zealand, or at any high school or district high school. 4. Subject to such regulations and conditions as may from time to time be prescribed, any scholarships, exhibitions, or bursaries from time to time granted may be held by those pupils to whom they are so granted at any college affiliated to the New Zealand University, or at any high school or district high school, or at any "school 5 classes," "special classes," "associated classes," or "college classes" established under "The Manual and Technical Instruction Act, 1900."

Interpretation of terms.

5. In this Act.—

"Secondary subjects" shall include all the branches of a 10 liberal education, and the ordinary branches of education prescribed by "The Education Act, 1877":

"Manual or technical instruction" shall include all manual and technical instruction as defined by "The Manual and Technical Instruction Act, 1900."

"Technical school" shall include any "school classes," "special classes," or "associated classes" established under "The Manual and Technical Instruction Act, 1900."
