## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to further amend "The Government Native Land Pur-Title. chases Act, 1877."

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in 5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Government Native Land Short Title. Purchases Acts Amendment Act, 1889." It shall be read and construed together with "The Government Native Land Purchases Act, 1877" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and "The Government 10 Native Land Purchases Act Amendment Act, 1878" (hereinafter

called "the said amending Act").

2. Where any negotiations have been heretofore or shall hereafter commencement of be entered into by or on behalf of the Crown for the purchase or negotiations may 13 acquisition of any land owned by aboriginal natives, whether under 15 their customs and usages or otherwise, and whether the title thereto has been determined by the Native Land Court or not, the Governor may notify in manner provided by the said Act that such negotiations have been entered into, and after the publication of such notification, all the provisions of the said Act and of the said amending Act shall be 20 deemed to apply to such land.

3. Any notification heretofore published in manner provided by Notification to be the said Act or to be hereafter published in pursuance of this Act conclusive evidence. shall be conclusive evidence in all Courts of the facts stated in such

notification.

Any notification heretofore published as aforesaid, and pur- Negotiations porting to be made in pursuance of the said Act shall be deemed to entered into after have been duly made in pursuance thereof, and the provisions of the said Act and of the said amending Act shall be deemed to apply to the land intended to be affected by such notification whether  $^{30}$  money was paid or negotiations entered into in respect of such land before or after the passing of the said Act.
