## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to remove doubts as to the power of the Title. Council of the Borough of Greymouth to levy Rates and Charges upon Shipping.

WHEREAS by "The County of Westland Act 1868" section one Preamble. hundred and forty-two it is provided that "all wharves or quays on the River Grey within the limits of the Borough of Greymouth shall be under the sole control and management of the Council of the Borough of 5 Greymouth and shall not be wharves or quays within the meaning or subject to the provisions of 'The Marine Act'' And whereas doubts have arisen as to the power of the Council of the Borough of Greymouth to levy rates and charges upon shipping using such wharves or quays and it is expedient to remove the same

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Greymouth Quays Short Title. Act 1869."

2. It shall be lawful for the Council of the Borough of Grey- Wharfage rates and mouth to charge and recover wharfage and tonnage rates on such tonnage dues may be levied. articles landed upon any wharf or quay on the River Grey within the limits of the Borough of Greymouth and upon such vessels loading unloading or refitting at or beside any such wharf or quay at such 20 rates as the said Borough Council may from time to time determine.

3. Before any such rates shall be recoverable under the provisions schedule of rates to of this Act a Schedule of the same and of the articles and vessels in belevied to be respect of which the same are levied shall be published in the County of Westland Gazette and every alteration of or addition to the said 25 Schedule shall be so published before any such alteration or addition shall have any force or effect.

4. All rates and charges made by the Borough Council of Grey- Rates hitherto levied mouth prior to the passing of this Act shall be deemed to be rates and under this Act. charges made under the provisions of this Act and shall be recoverable
