A BILL INTITULED

An Acr to enable Local Bodies to appoint Assessors to the Title. Assessment Court constituted under "The Government Valuation of Land Act Amendment Act, 1900."

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Government Valuation Short Title. of Land Act Amendment Act, 1906"; and it shall form part of 10 and be read together with "The Government Valuation of Land Act Amendment Act, 1900" (hereinafter called "the principal Act").

2. Subsection three of section fifteen of the principal Act is Local authorities hereby repealed, and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

"(3.) Of the other two members of the Court, one member shall court. be appointed by the Governor in Council and the other member by the local authority of the district whose roll has been revised."

3. For the purposes of the last preceding section "local Interpretation of authority" shall be deemed to mean any Borough Council, or County meaning of "local authority." 20 Council, or Town Board; and in any county where the Counties Act is suspended, the Chairmen of the Road Boards in such county shall be deemed to be the County Council:

Provided that two or more Borough Councils, or County Councils, or Town Boards may join for the purpose of appointing an 25 Assessor:

Provided further that if the local authority fails to appoint an Assessor, such appointment may be made by the Governor in Council.
