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A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Iron and Steel Industries Act, 1914. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Iron and Steel Industries Amendment Act, 1925, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Iron and Steel Industries Act, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

2. (1.) Section three of the principal Act is hereby amended by repealing paragraph (a) of subsection one, and substituting the following paragraph:— Increased rate of bounty in respect of pig iron.

“(a.) Thirty shillings a ton of pig iron.”

(2.) The increased rate of bounty provided for in this section shall be payable in respect of pig iron produced at any time after the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

3. (1.) No bounty shall be payable under the principal Act in respect of any pig iron, puddled bar iron, or steel made after the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and thirty-four. Bounties under principal Act not payable after 31st March, 1934.

(2.) Section six of the principal Act, and section two of the Iron and Steel Industries Amendment Act, 1920, are hereby repealed. Consequential repeals.
