A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT for including certain Lands within the Boundaries of the Borough of Invercargill. Title.

5 WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule to this Act adjoins the Borough of Invercargill: And whereas it is expedient that the said lands should be included within the boundaries of the Borough of Invercargill: Preamble.

10 BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Invercargill Borough Boundaries Extension Act, 1919. Short Title.

15 2. The lands described in the Schedule hereto shall be included in and shall form part of the Borough of Invercargill and shall be excluded from the County of Southland, and the boundaries of the Borough of Invercargill and of the County of Southland shall be altered accordingly. Part of Southland County added to Borough of Invercargill.

3. This Act shall come into force on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and *twenty*. Commencement of Act.

SCHEDULE.

Schedule.

ALL that parcel of land, being part of Section 26, Block I, Invercargill Hundred, and a road reserve adjoining same: commencing at the Waihopai River where Elles Road crosses same; and bounded thence on the East by Elles Road, a distance of 4266 links, more or less; thence on the south by other part of the said Section 26, being the present boundary of the Borough of Invercargill, 2385.5 links, more or less; thence on the west by part of Section 25 of said Block I, a distance of 906 links, more or less, and by a road reserve, a distance of 110 links, more or less; thence on the north-west by the Waihopai River, a distance of 6840 links, more or less, to the commencing-point in Elles Road.
