A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to vest in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Invercargill certain Parcels of Land in the Invercargill Hundred in trust for the purpose of a Cemetery.

Title.

5 WHEREAS the parcel of land firstly described in the Schedule hereto is vested in and held by His Majesty the King in trust for the purpose of a public burial-ground: And whereas the parcel of land secondly described in the said Schedule is vested in and held by His Majesty as a permanent reserve for an addition to the Invercargill Cemetery: And whereas it is expedient to vest both of the said parcels of land in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Invercargill in trust for the purpose of a cemetery:

Preamble.

15 BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Invercargill Cemetery Vesting Act, 1905."

Short Title.

20 2. In this Act, if not inconsistent with the context, "Corporation" means the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Invercargill constituted under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900."

Interpretation.

3. The parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto are hereby vested in the Corporation, in trust for the purpose of a cemetery.

Parcels of land described in the Schedule to vest in the Corporation.

Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Southland Land District, containing by admeasurement 20 acres, more or less, being Section No. 1 of 43 of Block II., Invercargill Hundred, on the Crown-grant record map of the Invercargill Hundred aforesaid. Bounded towards the north-west by a public road, 819 links; towards the north-east by Section No. 2 of 43 of the said block, 2505 links; towards the south-east by Section No. 3 of 43 of the said block, 813 links; and towards the south-west by a public road, 2400 links: be all the aforesaid linkages a little more or less.

Also, all that parcel of land in the Southland Land District, containing by admeasurement, exclusive of railway reserve, 10 acres 2 roods 36 perches, more or less, being Section No. 3 of 43 of Block II., Invercargill Hundred, on the Crown-grant record map of the Invercargill Hundred aforesaid. Bounded towards the north-west by Section No. 1 of 43 and Section No. 2 of 43 of the said block, 1510 links; towards the north-east by Section No. 42 of the said block, 780 links; towards the south-east by Section No. 44 of the said block, 1510 links; and towards the south-west by a public road, 780 links: save and excepting from the above-described area a railway reserve, 1 chain wide, intersecting the same: be all the aforesaid linkages a little more or less.
