The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

This Act is the Injury Prevention, Rehabilitation, and Compensation (Social Assistance) Amendment Act **2008**.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which 5 it receives the Royal assent.

11 Principal Act amended

This subpart amends the Injury Prevention, Rehabilitation, and Compensation Act 2001.

12 Purpose of this subpart

The purpose of this **subpart** is to amend the principal Act 5 so that the purposes for which it facilitates the disclosure of information by the Corporation to the department for the time being responsible for the administration of the Social Security Act 1964 include enabling the recovery of any debt due to the Crown in respect of any benefit.

13 Disclosure of information by Corporation for benefit purposes

- The heading to section 281 is amended by inserting "and (1) benefit debt recovery" after "benefit".
- Section 281 is amended by repealing subsection (2) and sub-(2) stituting the following subsection:
- (2)The purpose of this section is to facilitate the disclosure of information by the Corporation to the department for the time being responsible for the administration of the Social Security Act 1964 for all or any of the following purposes:
