IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION AMENDMENT BILL.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM.

The Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1931, is a temporary emergency measure which confers on the Governor-General in Council authority to make regulations restricting immigration into New Zealand while economic or financial conditions affecting trade and industry in New Zealand or any other special conditions render such a restriction expedient in the public interest. It was originally intended that the Act referred to should continue in force only up to 31st December, 1933; the duration of the Act was later extended to 31st December, 1935; the purpose of the present Bill is to provide for a further extension of one year.
