A BILL INTITULED

An Act to give Greater Powers to the Inch-Clutha River and Road Title. Board, and to provide for the Better Drainage of Inch-Clutha.

WHEREAS it is desirable to confer additional powers upon the Preamble. 5 Inch-Clutha River and Road Board:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Inch - Clutha Road, Short Title. 10 River, and Drainage Act, 1901."

2. In this Act, if not inconsistent with the context,—

Interpretation.

"The said Board" means the Inch-Clutha River and Road Board:

"The district" means the Inch-Clutha River and Road District.

3. The Inch-Clutha River and Road Board is hereby dissolved, Inch-Clutha River and shall henceforth cease to exist; all the powers, functions, duties, and Road dissolved. and authorities conferred upon the said Board shall and may henceforth be exercised and performed by the Inch-Clutha Road, River, 20 and Drainage Board.

4. All the powers conferred by the Drainage Act may be Powers conferred exercised and performed by the Inch-Clutha Road, River, and on Board. Drainage Board.

5. The members of the said Board shall be the members of the Members of Board. 25 Inch-Clutha Road, River, and Drainage Board for the time being.

6. The Inch-Clutha Road, River, and Drainage Board for the Special drainage annual period commencing the first day of November, one thousand rate. nine hundred and one, and for each and every annual period thereafter, may levy upon all rateable property in the district a special 30 drainage rate.

Maximum rate that may be levied. 7. The special drainage rate for each annual period shall not exceed *two* farthings in the pound on the annual rateable value.

8. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Drainage Act. 1893," the lands of the district shall be classified under three classes only, as follows: First-, second-, and third-class land—that is to say, "first-class lands" shall mean lands receiving most direct benefit; "second-class lands," those receiving less direct benefit; and "third-class lands," those receiving least direct benefit, from drainage-works.

9. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the whole 10 amount of rates that can be levied shall not exceed six farthings in the pound on the annual rateable value on all properties in the district.
