A BILL INTITULED

An Act to apply a Sum of Money out of the Public Account to the Title. Service of the Year ending the Thirty-first Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Imprest Supply Act, Short Title.

1890 (No. 2)."

2. Out of the Public Account there may be issued and applied, £175,000 advanced towards making good the Supply granted to Her Majesty by way of on Imprest towards service of year Imprest for the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of ending 31st March, March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, in addition to the sums mentioned in the Civil List Act, "The Imprest Supply Act, 1890," and other Acts, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole one hundred and seventy-five thousand pounds, that is to say, one hundred and fifty thousand pounds out of the Consolidated Fund, and twenty-five thousand pounds out of the Public Works Fund, to be charged in the manner hereafter to be expressed in any Act or Acts passed in this present session of Parliament for appropriating the public revenues of the colony for the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.
