A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to Apply Certain Sums of Money Out of the Title. Public Account and Other Accounts Towards the Service of the Year Ending on the Thirty-first Day

of March, Nineteen hundred and fifty-two. 5

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:----

1. This Act may be cited as the Imprest Supply Short Title. 10 Act (No. 2), 1951.

2. (1) In addition to all sums otherwise granted, Imprest grants. there may be issued and applied, by way of imprest, towards the service of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-two,-

15 (a) Out of the respective accounts (being part of the Public Account) mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, any sums not exceeding in respect of any such account the appropriate amount specified in that Schedule, and not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of fiftysix million five hundred and eight thousand pounds:

(b) Out of the respective accounts mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, any sums not exceeding in respect of any such account the appropriate amount specified in that Schedule, and not exceeding in the aggregate the sum 5 of five million three hundred and two thousand pounds.

(2) All sums issued and applied under the authority of this section shall be charged in the manner hereafter to be expressed in any Act for appropriating the public 10 revenues for the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-two.

3. (1) In addition to all sums otherwise authorized, there may from time to time during the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and 15 fifty-two, without further authority than this section, be transferred from the National Development Loans Account to the respective accounts mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto any sums not exceeding in respect of any such account the appropriate amount 20 specified in that Schedule, and not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of thirteen million five hundred thousand pounds.

(2) All sums transferred under the authority of this section shall be included in the amounts to be authorized 25 to be transferred from the National Development Loans Account by any Act for appropriating the public revenues for the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-two.

4. The Imprest Supply Act, 1951, is hereby amended **30** as follows:—

- (a) By omitting from subsection two of section two the words "passed in this present session of Parliament":
- (b) By omitting from subsection two of section three 35 the words "any Appropriation Act passed in this present session of Parliament", and substituting the words "any Act for appropriating the public revenues for the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred 40 and fifty-two".
