## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Juries Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Juries Act Amendment Short Title. Act, 1917, and it shall form part of and be read together with the Juries Act, 1908.
- 2. Section one hundred and fifty-two of the Juries Act, 1908, is Three-fourths 10 hereby amended by repealing the words "any civil case," and majority verdict in substituting in lieu thereof the words "any case, whether civil or criminal."

3. If during the trial of any case, either civil or criminal, a juror Death or incapacity shall have died, or shall have become through illness or other of juror. 15 unavoidable cause unfit to discharge his duty as a juror, it shall be lawful for the Judge to proceed with the trial as if the jury consisted of twelve jurors.
