## A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Judicature Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows :---

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Judicature Amendment Short Title. Act, 1920, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Judicature Act, 1908.
- 2. Every Judge holding office during good behaviour who has Superannuation 10 held office for a period of less than ten years but not less than five allowance of Judges years, and who satisfies the Governor-General in Council that he office for less than has become incapable of performing the duties of his office by reason ten years, may, by of any permanent infirmity, and thereupon resigns his office, shall be infirmity, resign entitled to a superannuation allowance in proportion to the amount from office.
- 15 of his annual salary at the time of resigning, computed at the rate of three twenty-fourths of such salary increased by one twenty-fourth of such salary for each complete year (if any) during which he has held office in excess of five years, but not exceeding in any case an allowance of six twenty-fourths of such salary.
