A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to make Provision for the Appointment and Election of a Board of Trustees for the Jubilee Institute for the Blind, Auckland. Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is “The Jubilee Institute for the Blind (Auckland) Act, 1905.” Short Title.

10 2. The Board of Trustees of the separate institution known as the Jubilee Institute for the Blind, Auckland, shall, notwithstanding anything in “The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885,” consist of nine persons, of whom five shall be appointed from time to time by the Governor, and the remaining four shall be elected by the 15 voluntary contributors in manner prescribed by the said Act. Constitution of Board

3. Such appointments shall be made by the Governor annually, within fourteen days before the second Thursday in January, on which day the persons so appointed shall come into office. When appointments to be made.

20 4. The Board of Trustees in office on the passing of this Act shall remain in office until the first election of Trustees under this Act. Existing Trustees.

25 5. (1.) The Board of Trustees shall cause their accounts to be balanced in every year to the thirty-first day of March in each year, and shall cause a true statement and account to be prepared of all contracts entered into, and of all moneys received or expended during the preceding year, and of all the available assets of and the debts then owing by the institution. Annual balance-sheet.

30 (2.) All such accounts shall be audited by the Audit Office, which for that purpose shall have and may exercise all such powers as it has under “The Public Revenues Act, 1891,” in respect of public moneys.

(3.) A copy of every such account shall, when audited, be sent to the Minister of Education.
