# JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS (REGULATION OF REPORTS).

#### ANALYSIS.

### A BILL INTITULED

An Act to regulate the Publication of Judicial Proceedings in such Title. Manner as to prevent Injury to Public Morals.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :--

1. This Act may be cited as the Judicial Proceedings (Regulation Short Title.

of Reports) Act, 1931.

2. It shall not be lawful to print or publish, or cause or procure to Restriction on 10 be printed or published in relation to any judicial proceedings, any publication of reports of judicial indecent matter or indecent medical, surgical, or physiological details, proceedings. being matter or details the publication of which would be calculated to injure public morals.

It shall not be lawful to print or publish, or cause or procure to Publication of 15 be printed or published, in relation to any judicial proceedings for disso- certain particulars lution of marriage, for nullity of marriage, for judicial separation, for restitution of conjugal rights, or for an affiliation order, any particulars other than the following, that is to say:

- (a) The names, addresses, and occupations of the parties and witnesses:
- (b) A concise statement of the charges, defences, and countercharges in support of which evidence has been given:

(c) Submissions on any point of law arising in the course of the proceedings, and the decision of the Court thereon:

(d) The summing-up of the Judge and the finding of the jury (if any) and the judgment of the Court and observations made by the Judge in giving judgment:

Provided that nothing in this section shall be held to permit the publication of anything contrary to the provisions of section two hereof.

4. If any person acts in contravention of the provisions of this Act Penalties. he shall in respect of each offence be liable, on summary conviction, to

imprisonment for a term not exceeding four months, or to a fine not exceeding five hundred pounds:

Provided that no person other than a proprietor, editor, master printer, or publisher shall be liable to be convicted under this Act.

Attorney-General's consent to be obtained.

Exemption of certain documents.

4A. No prosecution for an offence against this Act shall be commenced except by leave of the Attorney-General.

5. Nothing in this Act shall apply to the printing of any pleading, transcript of evidence, or other document for use in connection with any judicial proceedings, or the communication thereof to persons concerned 10 in the proceedings, or to the printing or publishing of any notice or report in pursuance of the directions of the Court; or to the printing or publishing of any matter in separate volume, or part of any bona fide series of law reports, which does not form part of any other publication, and consists solely of reports of proceedings in Courts of law, or in any 15 publication of a technical character bona fide intended for circulation among members of the legal or medical professions.
