This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1898." Title. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Kauri-gum Industry Short Title. Amendment Act, 1902"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1898" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act").

2. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the principal Act, the Com- Gum-digging in missioner of Crown Lands may, with the consent of the Commis- State forests. sioner of State Forests, issue licenses under the principal Act for digging gum on land subject to "The New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885," during the period from the first day of May to the 15 thirtieth day of September in each year.

(2.) A fee of ten shillings shall be payable in respect of every such license, which fee shall be paid into the State Forests Account.
