A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Licensing Act, 1881."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Licensing Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1891." It shall be read subject to the interpretation of "The Licensing Act, 1881."

Short Title.

10 2. It shall not be lawful for any owner, lessee, mortgagee, or other person to bind and compel any holder of a publican's license to obtain beer, ale and porter, wines and spirits, or any other goods from the said owner, lessee, or mortgagee of any licensed premises.

Publicans not bound to obtain liquors from particular parties.

15 3. Any contract or engagement entered into between the holder of any publican's license and any owner, lessee, or mortgagee of a licensed house or other person, contrary to the provisions of this Act, shall be null and void.

Contracts binding publicans to obtain liquor from particular parties illegal.
