A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The Licensing Act, 1881."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Licensing Act 1881 Short Title. Amendment Act, 1891." It shall be read subject to the interpretation of "The Licensing Act, 1881."

2. It shall not be lawful for any owner, lessee, mortgagee, or Publicans not bound other person to bind and compel any holder of a publican's license to to obtain liquors from particular 10 obtain beer, ale and porter, wines and spirits, or any other goods parties. from the said owner, lessee, or mortgagee of any licensed premises.

3. Any contract or engagement entered into between the holder Contracts binding of any publican's license and any owner, lessee, or mortgagee of a publicans to obtain licensed house or other person, contrary to the provisions of this Act, particular parties shall be pull and void 15 shall be null and void.
