A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to further amend "The Licensing Act, 1881."

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Licensing Act, 1881," Preamble. and the Acts amending the same:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zea-5 land in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Licensing Acts Amend- Short Title. ment Act, 1883."

- 2. The words "the said Act," wherever in this Act occurring, Interpretation. 10 shall mean "The Licensing Act, 1881."
- 3. The Returning Officer henceforth shall appoint the day for Duties of Returning the taking of the poll of ratepayers, as mentioned in section forty-six of the said Act, as well as appoint the day for the election of a 15 Licensing Committee.

4. The following provisions relating to the election of Licensing Provisions relating Committees shall come into operation on the passing of this Act:-

(1.) The Returning Officer shall appoint the day in the now next mittees. ensuing year for the election of members of the Licensing

- Committee under the provisions of subsection four of section thirteen of the said Act as if this Act had not been passed.
- (2.) Every member of a Licensing Committee elected at such election shall come into office on his election, and shall hold office for the term of one year, or until the election of his successor under the provisions of this section.
- (3.) The Returning Officer shall appoint the day in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five for the taking of the poll of ratepayers in the manner provided by section No. 120-2.

- (4.) Every member of a Licensing Committee elected in the year 5 one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five and thereafter shall come into office on his election, and shall hold office for *three* years, or until the election of his successor.
- (5.) From and after the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five the elections of Licensing Committees shall 10 be held on the days appointed under the said Act for the taking of the poll of ratepayers, and simultaneously therewith once in every *third* year only.

5. In case of any extraordinary vacancy occurring in any Committee, the Governor shall appoint a person to fill up such vacancy, 15 who shall hold office only until the next Committee is elected.

6. The word "annually," in subsection one of section thirteen of the said Act, the words "and thereafter in the same month in every year," in subsection four, and the whole of subsections eight and eighteen of the said section thirteen, are hereby repealed, and the said 20 section shall be read and construed as though the said repealed words and subsections respectively were omitted therefrom.

7. Section forty-six of the said Act is hereby amended by the omission of the words "The Chairman of the Licensing Committee," and the insertion, in lieu thereof, of the words "The Returning 25 Officer."

8. Subsection three of section twenty-eight of the said Act, so far as it relates to persons carrying on the business of auctioneers, shall not be deemed to apply to wholesale licenses.

9. Section fifty-nine of the said Act is hereby amended by the 30 omission of the words "on payment of costs."

10. Section one hundred and fifty of the said Act is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following is enacted, that is to say,—

Every record of an offence against any of the last four foregoing sections may, in the discretion of the Committee, be indorsed on the 35 license of the person convicted.

11. Section one hundred and fifty four of the said Act is hereby amended by the omission of the last paragraph, and the substitution of the following in lieu thereof:—

All licensed premises shall be closed on Christmas Day and Good 40 Friday, as if such days were respectively Sunday; but this provision shall not alter the hours during which such premises shall be closed on Sunday when Christmas Day immediately precedes or succeeds Sunday.

12. If any person against whom a prohibition order shall have 45 been made under section one hundred and sixty-seveu of the said Act shall be found in an intoxicated state such person shall be liable, on conviction thereof before any two Justices, to imprisonment for any term not exceeding one month; and, in the case of a second or any subsequent offence, for any term not being less than one month nor 50 exceeding three months; and if any such prohibited person shall be shown to have, while in a state of intoxication, created a disturbance

- (2.) The word "shall" in the second and third subsections of section two hundred and seven of the said Act shall be struck out, and the words "may, in the discretion of the Licensing Committee," shall be inserted in place thereof.

14. This Act shall be read with and as part of "The Licensing Act to be part of "The Licensing "The Licensing 15 Act, 1881."
