

LEGISLATURE AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THIS Bill repeals the provisions of the Legislature Act 1908 which relate to private Bills.

The new Standing Orders of the House of Representatives have replaced the repealed provisions in so far as they relate to the fees to be paid for the benefit of the Library Fund by the promoters of Private Bills, and in so far as they relate to inquiries into private Bills (which will be conducted by a Committee of the House).

The provisions of the principal Act as to inquiries into private estate Bills by the Supreme Court, and as to costs as between the promoters and opponents of Bills, have become obsolete and grown into disuse, and will accordingly be allowed to drop.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Legislature Amendment Act 1951, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Legislature Act 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
