A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Licensing Act 1908

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand
in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,
5 as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Licensing
Amendment Act 1958, and shall be read together with and
deemed part of the Licensing Act 1908 (hereinafter referred
to as the principal Act).

10 **2. Service of liquor with meals in licensed tourist houses**—
Section sixty-seven of the Licensing Amendment Act 1948
is hereby amended by inserting, after subsection two, the
following subsections:

15 “(2A) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (b) of sub-
section two of this section, the Commission may from time
to time, in its discretion, grant to the holder of any tourist-
house licence a permit to sell and dispose of liquor to any
person actually partaking of a meal, for consumption as part
20 of the meal, in any specified portion of the licensed premises
other than a dining-room, whether that specified portion is
within any building or not:

“Provided that no permit granted under this subsection
shall authorise any such sale or disposal of liquor as aforesaid
at any time after sunset.

25 “(2B) Any permit granted under subsection two A of this
section shall be in writing, and may be granted subject to
such conditions and restrictions as the Commission thinks fit,
and may at any time in like manner be varied or revoked.”
