LEGISLATURE AMENDMENT (RIGHT TO VOTE).

Title.  
1. Short Title.

2. Elector not on roll, but otherwise qualified,  
entitled to record his vote.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to make Provision for Electors recording their Votes whether their Names appear on the Parliamentary Electoral Roll or not. Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Legislature Act Amendment (Right to Vote) Act, 1914. Short Title.

10 2. On any day set apart for the purpose of the election of a member of Parliament or for the election of members of Parliament an elector who finds that his name is not on the electoral roll of the electorate in which he is otherwise entitled to vote, making a statement as to his *bona fides* as an elector of the electorate, on oath or by  
15 way of affirmation, in the presence of the Returning Officer in charge of any polling-booth within the electorate, shall be entitled to record his vote, in the same manner in which he would be entitled to vote if his name duly appeared on the electoral roll of the electorate in which he is entitled to be enrolled. Elector not on roll,  
but otherwise  
qualified, entitled  
to record his vote.
