A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to empower the Lyttelton Borough Council to erect Title. Gasworks.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Lyttelton Borough short Title. Council Empowering Act, 1901."

2. This Act shall be read subject to the interpretations respec- Interpretation. 10 tively contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900" (hereinafter called "the said Act").

5. Before laying before the Governor a memorial, as provided by subsection three of section eighteen of "The Public Works Act, 1894," the said Borough Council shall cause a notice to be gazetted, and be twice publicly notified, stating its intention to acquire the undertaking.

6. It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to transfer to the general account of the Borough of Lyttelton any surplus remaining to the credit of the separate account which the Council would be obliged by law to keep, showing the moneys accruing from gasworks or electric-light works: Provided always that no moneys 15 shall be so transferred till due provision is first made for all sums with which the separate account is by law chargeable.
