A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to confer certain Powers upon Land Boards.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Land Boards' Powers Act, 1904"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Land Act, 1892" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act").

Short Title.

2. Notwithstanding anything in section forty-nine of the principal Act contained, it shall be lawful for the Board to modify or vary the conditions imposed in any lease or by any regulations issued under the authority of the said Act or its amendments, or of "The Land for Settlements Consolidation Act, 1900," or its amendments, in so far as regards the cropping, cultivating, clearing, or laying down in grass of any land, in such manner as it deems expedient in view of the circumstances of any particular case or of the conditions obtaining in any particular locality.
