## A BILL INTITULED.

AN ACT to make provision for the Settlement of the  
Award of the Arbitrators appointed under "The  
Land Claims Arbitration Act 1867."

WHEREAS the Arbitrators appointed under the provisions of "The  
Land Claims Arbitration Act 1867" did award and adjudge to  
James Busby the sum of thirty-six thousand eight hundred pounds in  
respect of the special damages which they found he had suffered in  
respect to his claims to land at Ngunguru Wangarei and Waipu and  
whereas in compliance with the provisions of the said Act the Governor  
did issue to the said James Busby in liquidation of the said award certain  
scrip which it was provided by the ninth clause of the said Act should  
be received in payment for any lands to be selected by the said James  
Busby within the Province of Auckland out of any lands open for  
sale or selection under the provisions of the laws for the time being in  
force within the said Province relating to the disposal of Waste Lands  
of the Crown And whereas the Superintendent of the said Province  
did issue certain Proclamations published in the Auckland Provincial  
Gazette withdrawing from sale or selection all lands which had been  
before that time open for sale or selection by which the said James  
Busby was prevented from selecting the said land and the scrip  
issued to him under the hand of the Governor was rendered useless  
and of no value And whereas it was further provided by the said  
"Land Claims Arbitration Act 1867" that it should be lawful for the  
Governor in further satisfaction of the said award to issue to the said  
James Busby a Crown Grant or Crown Grants of any lands comprised  
within his original claims and remaining unsold.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—

Short Title.

**1.** The Short Title of this Act shall be “The Land Claims Arbitration Act Supplementary Act 1869.”

Scrap declared null and void.

**2.** That the said scrip shall be and is hereby cancelled and made null and void.

Sum awarded by the Arbitrators to be paid in cash and debentures.

**3.** It shall be lawful for the Treasurer of the Colony of New Zealand to issue to the said James Busby the sum of thirty-six thousand eight hundred pounds in cash and debentures that is to say the sum of six thousand eight hundred pounds in cash on the passing of this Act together with a further sum of four hundred and eighty-four pounds nineteen shillings being the amount paid for the survey of the lands of Wangarei and Waipu and thirty thousand pounds in debentures bearing interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum which debentures shall be issued in the usual form and shall be made payable by the Colonial Treasurer of New Zealand for the time being to the said James Busby his executors administrators or assigns in sums of five thousand pounds on the thirtieth day of *June* in each of the years one thousand eight hundred and seventy one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four and one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

Interest when to be paid.

Principal sums on the 30th day of *June* of each year as they fall due.

**4.** The interest on the said debentures shall be made payable on the thirtieth day of *June* and the thirty-first day of *December* in each of the said years and also the principal sums as they fall due either at the Colonial Treasury in Wellington or by the Agent of the General Government at Auckland or by the Agent of the General Government in London.

Principal and interest of debentures to be a charge on the Provincial Revenues of Auckland. Land in question released to Province of Auckland.

**5.** The Colonial Treasurer shall charge the said interest and principal sums against the Provincial Revenue of Auckland at the dates at which the same shall be respectively paid.

**6.** In consideration of the said sum of thirty-six thousand eight hundred pounds to be received by the said James Busby the lands remaining unsold within the original claims of the said James Busby at Ngunguru Wangarei and Waipu shall be and hereby are transferred to the Provincial Government of Auckland and made disposable by the said Government in like manner as the Waste Lands of the Crown in that Province.
