A BILL INTITULED AN ACT to make further Provision for the Final Settleitle. ment of Land Claims.

WHEREAS there yet remain certain unsettled various claims to Presmble. land within the Colony of New Zealand, arising out of dealings with the aboriginal inhabitants thercof : (which-claims are enumerated in the-Schedule-hereto), and it-is-expedient-to-make-further-provision for-the

- 5 final-settlement thereof :- And-whereas-sundry-Crown-grants-of-doubtful validity-have been issued in respect of some of the aforesaid claims under the-Public-Scal of the Colony of New-Zealand, prior-to-the passing-of-the Act-of-ene-thousand-eight-hundred-and-tifty-six :--- And-whereas-all-such Crown-grants-were-called-in-under-the-provisions of the Act-of-one-thousand
- 10 eight hundred-and-fifty-six-in-order-that-new-grants-might be issued in-lieu thereof: And-whereas in some-cases-no-claim-for-the-issue of a new-grant has been made, and in other cases, although a claim for a new grant has been-made, the claim has not been prosocuted to a final issue: And whereas it is not expedient that any such claims should be allowed to 15 remain open for an indefinite period :
- BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-
- 1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Land Claims Final Short Title. 20 Settlement Act, 1878."
 - 2. The terms-"Act-of-one-thousand-eight hundred-and-fifty six," Interpretation clause. and-"Act-of-one-thousand-eight-hundred-and-fifty-eight," said Acts herein used, shall mean "The Land Claims Settlement Act, 1856," and "The Land Claims Settlement Extension Act, 1858." respectively.
- 25 The term "Commissioners" shall mean any Commissioner appointed under "The Land Claims Settlement Act, 1856." Act of-one thousand eight-hundred-and-fifty-six,-and-every-such-Commissioner-shall-be-deemed to have-the-powers-hereby vested-in-the-Commissioners. The provisions of this-Act-shall-be-of-force,-anything-in-the-Act of one thousand eight-hun-
- 30 dred-and-fifty-six-and-the-rules-established-thereunder,-or-in-the-Act-of-one thousand-eight-hundred-and-fifty-eight, to-the-contrary-notwithstanding. No. 13-3.

Claims not prosecuted to lapse.

Selections of land to be made in prescribed time, or right of selection to lapse.

Commissioners shall determine claims in certain cases.

Forty-third and forty-fourth sections of Act of 1856 repealed.

Saving clause.

Commissioners may admit hearing under restrictions.

3. Any-of-the Every claims-in-the Schedule-hereto capable of being prosecuted under the said Acts which shall not be prosecuted before the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, shall be deemed to have lapsed. and the Commissioners shall-adjudge-such claims-to-have lapsed, and notice of such adjudication shall-be-published-in-the-New-Zealand-Gazette: Provided-always-that-the Commissioners may, in-their-discretion, in-any-case, upon reasonable grounds being shown, extend such period, such extension not-to-exceed six months.

4 .- The land in any claim-so-adjudged to have lapsed shall be freed from-the-right, title, or interest of any claimant-whomsoever.

5. 4. Whenever any selection of land is required to be made under the provisions of the said Acts of one thousand eight-hundred and fiftysix, or the Act of one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight, the Commissioners may prescribe a period within which such selection shall be made, and if the selection be not made within such period, such right 15of selection shall lapse and be deemed abandoned, and the claimant or claimants shall have no further right, title, or interest in respect of such claim, or in respect of any land the subject of such claim.

6. 5. In any claim in which difficulties exist in the way of obtaining quiet possession of the land to which the claimant is entitled, and in 20which the survey of the claim cannot be made in a reasonable time, to be fixed by the Commissioners, the Commissioners shall determine the claim by directing a grant of other land in exchange, or by the issue of scrip, as provided in section three of "The Land Claims Settlement Act, 1858." of one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight. 25

7. 6. The forty-third and forty-fourth sections of "The Land Claims Settlement Act, 1856," are Act-of one-thousand-oight hundred and fiftysix-is hereby repealed, and in lieu-thereof it is enacted as follows : In all cases of surveys and maps required by the said Acts of one-thousand eight-hundred-and-fifty-six the Commissioners shall order such surveys 30or maps to be made under their own direction; but such repeal shall not apply to any case in which a claimant shall have made surveys under the said Acts.

New clauses.

7. Notwithstanding anything in the said Acts contained, the Commissioners may admit to hearing the claimants in claims sixtyfour and one thousand one hundred and twenty-eight, subject to the following restrictions :

In claim one thousand one hundred and twenty-eight, the claimant shall not obtain any higher award than such claimant would have received if the claim had been capable of being notified under the said Acts :

In claim sixty-four, the claimant shall be admitted to hearing on the following conditions :

- (1.) If the claim be made under any original purchase from 45the Natives by the claimant, or any agent for him, other than the purchase reported on by Commissioner Godfrey in cases seventy-three and seventy-three B, the claim shall be heard and determined on the same terms, and subject to the same restrictions, as all other original claims under 50the Land Claims Ordinance, session ten, number one.
- (2.) If the claim be made under or in respect of any share in the purchase in cases seventy-three and seventy-three B of W. E. Cormack, then the claimant shall, on proof of such share, be entitled to receive scrip entitling him to select such a number of acres of rural land in the Provincial 55 District of Auckland as shall bear the same proportion to the maximum grant of two thousand five hundred and sixty acres recommended by Commissioner Godfrey in

respect of the said cases seventy-three and seventy-three B, as the number of acres comprised in the original claim case forty-three bears to the total number of acres comprised in all the cases admitted before Commissioner Godfrey to have shared in the purchases in respect whereof such maximum grant was recommended.

8. For the purpose of giving due publicity to this Act, and to all Act to be advertised claimants affected by the same, a notification of the provisions of this Act relating to notices to be given, compensation awarded, and time

10 limited for the exercise of scrip issued hereunder, shall be published in the London *Times* newspaper, or in such other newspaper in London, and in such manner, as the Secretary for Crown Lands shall appoint.

Struck out.

8. The forty-fourth section of the Act of one thousand eight hun-15 dred and fifty-six is hereby repealed.

9. And whereas the claimants in claims numbers sixty-four and one thousand one hundred and twenty-cight were unable, through circumstances over which they had no control, to prosecute their claims within the time prescribed by the Act of one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and it is expedient that relief should be given in

respect of the said claims : Be it therefore further enacted that the Commissioners are hereby empowered to investigate the said claims numbers sixty-four and one thousand one hundred and twenty-eight, and to make such orders and 25adjudication therein as they shall deem to be just.

10. Sections seven and eight of this Act shall not apply to any case in which a claimant shall have made surveys under the sections repealed by the said sections seven and eight.

11. Nothing contained in this Act shall be deemed to revive any claim that may have been considered to have lapsed, although the 30 same may be included in the Schedule hereto or mentioned in this Act.
