A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to alter the Constitution of the Legislative Council of
New Zealand. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in
5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:— Preamble.

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Legislative Council Act,
1890." Short Title.

10 2. From and after the passing of this Act all members appointed by the Governor to the Legislative Council shall be appointed for ten years only: Provided that members so appointed shall, when their term of office is completed, or in the event of their resignation before the completion of their term of office, be eligible for reappointment by the Governor. Members to be appointed for ten years and eligible for reappointment.

15 3. Whenever, after the passing of this Act, a vacancy occurs in the office of Speaker of the Legislative Council the members of the Legislative Council shall proceed to the choice of one of their members to be the Speaker thereof for ten years, and such choice, on being confirmed by the Governor, shall be valid and effectual. Speaker to be elected by members.
