A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Lights on Vehicles Act, 1915.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows :--

1. This Act may be cited as the Lights on Vehicles Amend- Short Title. ment Act, 1926, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Lights on Vehicles Act, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. The principal Act shall have no application in respect of Principal Act to have 10 motor-vehicles if and so long as they are subject to any regulations motor-vehicles that as to lighting made pursuant to the powers in that behalf conferred are for the time on the Governor-General by the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924.

3. (1.) Every bicycle, tricycle, or other similar machine (not being 15 a motor-vehicle within the meaning of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924) shall be equipped with a suitable reflector, so placed as to show clearly Bicycles to be to the rear of the machine a bright red reflection of any following light equipped with red which falls on the machine.

(2.) Every person who is in charge of any such machine not so 20 equipped at a time when it is required by the principal Act to carry a light commits an offence, and is liable to a fine of one pound.
