2. Solicitor in practice for five years may be admitted and enrolled as barrister. Fee.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Law relating to Law Practitioners.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5.

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Law Practitioners Act Amendment Act, 1898."

Short Title.

2. (1.) Every solicitor of the Supreme Court, not admitted as a barrister, shall be entitled to be admitted and enrolled and to practise as a barrister of that Court on application in that behalf to a Judge if the Judge is satisfied that the applicant is of good character and for at least five years has been in active practice as a solicitor of that Court.

Solicitor in practice for five years may be admitted and enrolled as barrister.

(2.) The fee payable for every admission under this section shall be five pounds five shillings.
