A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Law Practitioners Act, 1882."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Law Practitioners Act Amendment Act, 1905." Short Title.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Law Practitioners Act, 1882," it shall be lawful for any person of good moral character to conduct, prosecute, and defend any action, suit, or other proceeding before any Justice or Justices of the Peace, or Stipendiary Magistrate, in any Court in New Zealand, on behalf of any party to such action, suit, or other proceeding aforesaid, if such person shall be so specially authorised by such party in writing. Any person can appear on behalf of accused.
