### A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Law Practitioners Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Law Practitioners Amendment Act, 1919, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Law Practitioners Act, 1908.

Short Title.

2. (1.) Where any solicitor of the Supreme Court shall have actually served with the Expeditionary Force in the war with Germany the period of the service of such solicitor between the date of his acceptance for service and his discharge shall be deemed to be part of the period of five years referred to in section five of the Law Practitioners Act, 1908, whether such solicitor shall at the time of his acceptance for service been in active practice as a solicitor or managing clerk to a solicitor or not.

Solicitors entitled to count period of service with Expeditionary Force for purpose of qualifying for admission as barristers.

(2.) Section twenty-one of the War Legislation Amendment Act, 1916, is hereby repealed.
