## A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Law Practitioners Act 1861." Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Law Practitioners Short Title 5 Act Amendment Act 1869."

2. This Act shall be read with and construed as part of "The Act to form part of Law Practitioners Act 1861" hereinafter referred to as "the said "Law Practitioners Act 1861." Act."

- 3. Any person who shall have been appointed to be a Resident Resident Magistrates 10 Magistrate of any district or districts under "The Resident Magistrates who have held Act 1867" and shall have for a period of three years at the least held three years entitled such appointment for any one such district or if transferred from one to be called to the Raw district to another shall have held appointments for any one or more of such districts for such period as shall make an aggregate of three

- 20 of the Supreme Court of New Zealand after he shall have passed such examination as provided in sections six and nine of the said Act and all the provisions of the said Act relating to persons entitled to be admitted or admitted under the said Act shall apply to persons entitled to be admitted or admitted under this Act.
