A BILL INTITULED

An Act to promote Free Trade in Land.

Title

WHEREAS the power of placing restrictions on the alienability of land is Preamble. prejudicial to the interests of the colony, and it is therefore desirable that such 5 restrictions should be prohibited:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

- 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Land Sale Restrictions Removal Short Title. Act, 1882."
- 2. It shall not be lawful for any person, by deed or will, to restrain the Owner of legal estate 10 alienation of land; and the holder of the legal estate for the time being under may dispose of land as absolute owner. and by virtue of any deed or will shall, for the purpose of sale and exchange, be deemed to be the absolute owner thereof, without any restriction.

The word "land" includes any estate or interest in real property.

- 3. Committees of the estates of lunatics and guardians of infants shall, for Committees of luna-15 the purposes of this Act, be deemed to be the holders of the legal estate.
 - 4. The money accruing from any such sale or exchange shall, mutatis Money accruing from mutandis, be subject to the like trusts, rights, liabilities, claims, and demands disposal subject to (if any) as exist in respect of the land.
- 5. The receipt in writing of any person to whom any money shall become Receipts to be dis-20 payable by virtue of this Act shall effectually discharge the person paying the same from seeing to the application or being answerable for the misapplication or non-application thereof, and from inquiry into the necessity or propriety of any transaction in consequence whereof such money may have become payable.
