LICENSING TRUSTS AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill makes miscellaneous amendments to the Licensing Trusts Act 1949.

Clause 2: At present, all members of licensing Trusts are entitled to remuneration fixed by the Minister of Finance under the Fees and Travelling Allowances Act 1951, and to travelling expenses under that Act. The effect of this clause is that, after the expiry of the terms of office of existing members, only the Chairman will receive remuneration, but all members will continue to receive travelling expenses.

Clause 3: At present, all licensing Trusts, including local Trusts, are required to bank with the Bank of New Zealand. This clause authorizes Trusts to bank with any bank.

Clause 4: This clause authorizes all licensing Trusts to contribute to the National Provident Fund, or any other fund or scheme approved by the Minister of Finance, for the purpose of providing superannuation or retiring allowances for their officers and employees. It also gives to all Trusts the same powers as local authorities have to make grants to employees on their retirement or to dependants of employees on the death of the latter.

Clause 5 makes it clear that a local licensing Trust may hold more than one licence under the Licensing Act 1908.

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Licensing Trusts Act 1949. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority 5 of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Licensing Trusts Short Title. Amendment Act 1953, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Licensing Trusts Act 1949 1949, No. 43 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(4) Notwithstanding anything in subsections one to three of this section, every person holding office as a member of any licensing Trust at the passing of this Act shall be entitled to remuneration to the same extent and in the same manner as if this section had not been 40 passed, until his current term of office expires or until he sooner vacates office under the principal Act or, as the case may be, under the Masterton Licensing Trust Act 1947 or the Invercargill Licensing Trust Act 1950.
