## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to prevent the Removal from the Colony of Maori Title. Antiquities.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zea-5 land in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Maori Antiquities short Title. Act, 1901.'

2. In this Act, if not inconsistent with the context, the term Interpretation. 10 "Maori antiquities" includes any Maori relics, or articles manufactured with ancient Maori tools and according to Maori methods, er and all other articles or things of historical or scientific value or interest and relating to New Zealand, but does not include any private collection not intended for sale, or nor botanical or mineral 15 collections or specimens.

Any person may at any time present submit to an authorised Provision for Government officer any Maori antiquity, and, subject to the consent or di pose of Maori of the Colonial Secretary, obtain permission to remove the same from antiquities. the colony or dispose thereof by sale or otherwise at any time there-30 after. which permission-shall-be-signified by a stamp-or-mark-made-thereon

- 7. In case any dispute arises as to whether any article or thing comes within the scope of this Act, such dispute shall be determined by the Colonial Secretary.
  - 8. The Governor may from time to time make regulations,—
  - (1.) Prescribing the duties and powers of officers of Police and 5 Customs in enforcing the provisions of this Act;
  - (2.) Prescribing penalties for the breach of any such regulation;
  - (3.) Prescribing anything required for the more effectual carrying-out of the provisions of this Act.
