## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Marriage Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority

1. This Act may be cited as the Marriage Amend- Short Title. ment Act, 1933, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Marriage Act, 1908 (hereinafter See Reprint referred to as the principal Act).

2. (1) A marriage between persons either of whom is

under the age of sixteen years shall be void:

Provided that in any proceedings against a person either party is charged under section two hundred and sixteen of the Crimes Act, 1908, or charged with indecent assault, it V, c. 36, s. 1 15 shall be a sufficient defence to prove that at the time when the offence is alleged to have been committed he See Reprint of Statutes, had reasonable cause to believe that the girl in respect Vol. II, p. 243 of whom it is alleged to have been committed was his wife.

(2) Nothing in this section shall affect any marriage solemnized or contracted before the passing of this Act, and any such marriage shall be or become valid in any case where, if this Act had not been passed, it would be or become valid.

Women may be Officiating Ministers. 3. A woman shall not be disqualified by reason of her sex from being an Officiating Minister within the meaning of the principal Act, or from having her name entered upon the List of Officiating Ministers compiled for the purposes of that Act.
