### A BILL INTITULED

## Act to declare the Privileges of the House of Title. AN Representatives with respect to Money Bills and to amend the Law respecting the attendance of Members of the Legislative Council.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament Assembled and by the authority of the same as follows-

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Money Bills Act 1869." Short Title.

 2. All Bills for appropriating any part of the Revenue of New Money Bills to
5 Zealand and for imposing any duty rate tax rent return or impost shall originate in House of Representatives and may be rejected but not altered by the Legislative Council.

3. So much of the thirty-sixth section of the Constitution Act as Repeal of part of enacts that if any Legislative Councillor of New Zealand shall for two Section thirty-six of 10 successive Sessions of the General Assembly without the permission of
