A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876."

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend in certain particulars "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876" (hereinafter called "the said Act"):

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Municipal Corporations Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878."

2. Section three hundred and forty-two of the said Act is hereby repealed and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

A copy of any by-law, sealed with the common seal of the Corporation, shall be received as evidence of the same having been in force within any borough at the time of its becoming a borough under the said Act, and of the same having been duly made as by law provided in that behalf, unless in either case the contrary is proved; and a copy of any by-law sealed with the seal of the Corporation shall be received as evidence of any by-law made since the said Act came into force, and that the same was duly made as by the said Act provided, unless the contrary is proved.
