EXPLANATORY NOTE

Clause 2: This clause limits the right of the Meat Producers Board to sell meat overseas on its own behalf. The right is limited to sale in countries where no substantial market for New Zealand meat exists. The clause replaces an existing provision and the effect of the proposed change is to permit the Board to subscribe for shares in, advance money, or give guarantees to companies engaged in the sale, storage, or transport of New Zealand meat, irrespective of whether or not the meat is sold in an undeveloped market.

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Meat Export Control Act 1921-22

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand
in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,
5 as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Meat Export Control Amendment Act (No. 2) 1962, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat Export Control Act 1921-22* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

10 **2. Board may buy and sell meat for certain purposes**—
(1) Section 14B of the principal Act (as inserted by section 3 of the Meat Export Control Amendment Act 1959) is hereby amended by inserting, after subsection (1), the following subsection:

2 *Meat Export Control Amendment (No. 2)*

“(1A) The powers conferred on the Board by subsection (1) of this section shall be exercised by the Board for the purposes of establishing markets for New Zealand meat in countries where, in the opinion of the Board, no market or no substantial market for New Zealand meat or for a particular class of that meat exists and of expanding or maintaining markets in those countries, and no contract under the said subsection (1) for the sale of meat shall be entered into by the Board otherwise than for a purpose referred to in this subsection.” 5 10

(2) Subsection (3) of section 14B of the principal Act is hereby repealed.
