## MOUNTAIN GUIDES.

### ANALYSIS.

### A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to make Provision for the Licensing of Mountain Guides and  
for Matters incidental thereto. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand  
5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Mountain Guides Act, 1931. Short Title.

2. This Act shall be administered by the Minister for the time  
being charged with the administration of the Tourist and Health  
10 Resorts Control Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the Minister). Administration of Act.

3. The Governor-General may from time to time, by Order  
in Council, make regulations for all or any of the following purposes :— Power to make regulations for licensing of guides.

(a) The licensing of guides for expeditions into mountainous or  
unfrequented parts of New Zealand, and the issue, renewal,  
15 revocation, and cancellation of licenses :

(b) Prescribing the classes and forms of such licenses, the qualifica-  
tions of applicants therefor, the conditions upon which they  
may be issued, and the fees payable in respect thereof :

(c) Classifying such expeditions ; and prescribing the minimum  
20 number of licensed guides that may be employed on  
any expedition or class of expedition, and the classification  
of such guides ; and prescribing the terms and conditions  
upon which such guides may be so employed :

(d) Prohibiting any person from acting for remuneration as a  
25 guide on any such expedition except in pursuance of a  
license in that behalf and in accordance with regulations  
under this Act ; and prohibiting any person from employing  
any unlicensed person to act for remuneration as a guide  
on any such expedition :

(e) Establishing a Board with power to issue, renew, and revoke  
30 licenses, and with such other powers and functions in

relation to the foregoing matters as may be prescribed ; and prescribing the constitution and procedure of such Board ; and fixing travelling and other allowances for the members thereof :

- (f) Prescribing fines, not exceeding *twenty* pounds in any case, for failure to comply with the provisions of any regulations under this Act : 5
- (g) Making any provision that may be convenient for the administration of this Act, or that may be desirable or necessary in order to carry its objects into full effect. 10
