ANALYSIS:

Title.

Preamble.

1. All persons heretofore Gazetted as Justices to be deemed to have been duly appointed.

2. Short Title.

A BILL to remove doubts respecting the validity of the appointment of certain Title.

Justices of the Peace.

WHEREAS, doubts have arisen respecting the validity of the appointments Preamble. of certain persons to be Justices of the Peace, and it is expedient that such doubts be removed.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand as follows:-

I. All persons whose appointments as Justices of the Peace for the Colony or Islands of New Zealand, or for any Province of the said Colony, hat, at any time heretofore been notified in the New Zealand "Government Gazette" by the direction of the Governor of the said Colony, or of the Officer lawfully administering the Government thereof, shall be deemed to have been duly appointed as such Justices notwithstanding such persons may not have been undy appointed by Commisson under the Court Seal of the Colony, pending any and notwithstanding other defect or informality in their appointments

2. This Act shall be intituled and may be cited as the "Magistrates' Short Title.
