A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to authorise a Grant of Land to George McLean, of Hawera. Title.

WHEREAS Te Katene, a member of the Native Contingent, having, Preamble.
 in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, completed
 5 the service required of him to entitle him to eighty acres of land
 under the regulations for the time being in force, which authorised
 original service, together with substituted service, was refused a
 grant of such land on the supposition that he had not served a
 sufficient term of service to entitle him thereto: And whereas the
 10 aforesaid Te Katene, in the year aforesaid, in expectation that a grant
 of such land would be issued to him, sold his interest therein to one
 Captain William McDonald, who sold to George McLean, of Hawera,
 and authority is now required to enable a grant of the said land to be
 made to the said George McLean as derivative purchaser from Te
 15 Katene aforesaid:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The McLean Land Act, Short Title.
20 1891."

2. The Governor may grant to George McLean, of Hawera, Governor may grant
 not exceeding eighty acres of land within section number one hun- eighty acres to
 dred of the Native Contingent Military Settlers' Block, in the Hawera G. McLean.
 District, containing ninety-one acres; such eighty acres to be selected
 25 by the aforesaid George McLean, and approved by the Commissioner
 of Crown Lands for the Taranaki Land District.

3. The land authorised to be granted under this Act shall be Land to be in full
 deemed to be in full satisfaction of the claim of land of Te Katene in satisfaction of Te
 respect of his services as aforesaid, and of all persons deriving through Katene's claim.
