A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to give Relief to Aboriginal Natives.

WHEREAS since the granting of a Responsible Government for New Zealand, under the provisions of "The New Zealand Constitution Act, 1852," it is most expedient and desirable that the New Zealand Government may have power to grant a mission to England for four Maoris to be chosen by the Maori members of the General Assembly for the time being:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Maori Relief Act, 1887." Short Title.
- 2. This Act shall come into force on the first day of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven. Commencement of Act.
- 3. Schedule A, hereunto affixed, shall be incorporated into and read as a portion of this Act. Schedule A incorporated with this Act.
- 4. The power of the New Zealand Government may be extended to submit to the Imperial Parliament, under the provisions of "The New Zealand Constitution Act, 1852," certain proposals set down in the Schedule hereto affecting the Maori race, with four Maoris to be chosen by the Maori members of the General Assembly for the time being.
