Title.

WHEREAS since the granting of a Responsible Government for Preamble. New Zealand, under the provisions of "The New Zealand Constitution Act, 1852," it is most expedient and desirable that the New Zealand Government may have power to grant a mission to England for four Maoris to be chosen by the Maori members of the General Assembly for the time being:

Be it therefore enacted by the General Assembly of New 10 Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Maori Relief Act, 1887."

2. This Act shall come into force on the first day of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

3. Schedule A, hereunto affixed, shall be incorporated into and Schedule A incor-
