## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to permit a certain Deviation in the Line of Route of the Title. New Zealand Midland Railway, and for other purposes.

WHEREAS the New Zealand Midland Railway Company (Limited) Preamble. 5 has requested Her Majesty the Queen to permit a certain deviation from the line of railway mentioned in the contract entered into between Her said Majesty and the said company, bearing date the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and made in accordance with the provisions of "The Midland Railway

10 Contract Act, 1887:" And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made by law authorising such deviation as hereinafter provided, and for such other purposes as in this Act mentioned:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,

his hand indorsed upon the said contract, to authorise the said company to make such deviation in accordance with the description thereof set out in the Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as may be practicable.

Alterations made by this Act to be deemed part of contract. 3. The deviation in the line of railway sanctioned by this Act, when authorised as hereinbefore provided, shall be deemed to form part of the said contract in the same manner as if such contract had originally contained provisions in that behalf, and shall be binding on the parties thereto accordingly.

#### SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point on the Springfield-Brunnerton Section of the Midland Railway, at or near Stoney Creek, distant from Brunnerton about 10 miles 55 chains: proceeding thence generally in an easterly and southerly direction, and to the eastward of Lake Brunner, to a point on the Contract-line of the said Midland Railway on the north bank of the Teremakau River, distant from Brunnerton about 28 miles 44 chains: the total distance of the said deviation being 18 miles or thereabouts.
