A BILL INTITULED

Acr to amend the Law relating to the Salaries and Title. Allowances of Responsible Ministers of the Crown.

WHEREAS since the passing of "The Ministers' Salaries and Preamble. 5 Allowances Act, 1887" (hereinafter called "the principal Act"), the departmental and other work of the General Government has greatly increased, and it is therefore expedient that the number of Ministers to whom salaries are appropriated should be increased, and that their salaries should be restored to the rate existing at the time when the 10 principal Act was passed:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Ministers' Salaries and Short Title. 15 Allowances Amendment Act, 1900," and it shall form part of and be read together with the principal Act.

2. Sections three and four of the principal Act are hereby re- Repeal. pealed, and in lieu thereof it is hereby enacted that from and after Annual approthe commencement of this Act there shall be payable to Her Majesty, Ministers' salaries. 20 out of the Consolidated Fund, the annual sum of eleven thousand

seven hundred and fifty pounds for the purpose of defraying the annual salaries of Ministers, as follows:—

The Prime Minister 1,750 Eight other Ministers, each £1,250 ... 25 10,000 £11.750

Salaried Ministers to be members of Executive Council. 4. Each of the Ministers to whom salaries are appropriated as aforesaid shall be a member of the Executive Council, holding one or more of the offices mentioned or included in the Third Schedule to "The Civil List Act 1863 Amendment Act, 1873."

Additional Ministerial offices.

5. The said Third Schedule is hereby extended by including therein the following offices, that is to say,—

Minister of Defence, Minister of Education, Minister of Labour, Minister of Public Health, Minister for Railways,
