A BILL INTITULED

- An Act to provide for the Closing of certain Roads through Martin Title. Square, Town of Martinborough, and for the Fencing of the said Square.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
 - 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Martinborough Town Short Title. Board Square Fencing and Road Closing Act, 1906."
- 10 2. Martin Square is all that area in the Town of Martinborough Martin Square shown on plan deposited in the Land Transfer Office, Wellington, as vested in Town Board. Number 248, and now vested in the Martinborough Town Board.
- 3. From and after the making of a special order in that behalf Certain roads cease by the Martinborough Town Board, which special order it is hereby to be highways. 15 empowered to make, the roads described in the First Schedule hereto shall cease to be highways, and the soil thereof shall thereafter be and remain subject to all rights and laws to which the said Martin Square is subject.
- 4. It shall be lawful for the Martinborough Town Board by Power to create 20 special order to fence and enclose that part of the said Martin Square described in the Second Schedule hereto, and to create and dedicate highways around the part so fenced or enclosed, in such manner and to such extent as to it may seem best.

SCHEDULES.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land, containing by admeasurement 2 roods 32 perches. commencing at a point 100 links distant in a north-easterly direction from the north-eastern corner of Section 366 on the plan of the Town of Martinborough; running thence in a north-easterly direction along part of Martin Square a distance of 150 links; thence in a south-easterly direction along other part of the said Martin Square a distance of 140 links; thence again in a north-easterly direction along other part of the said Martin Square a distance of 100 links; thence again in a north-westerly direction along other part of the said Martin Square a distance of 140 links; thence again along other part of the said Martin Square in a northeasterly direction a distance of 150 links; thence again in a north-westerly direction along other part of the said Martin Square a distance of 100 links; thence again in a south-westerly direction along other part of the said Martin Square a distance of 150 links; thence again in a north-westerly direction along other part of the said Martin Square a distance of 150 links; thence again in a south-westerly direction along other part of the said Martin Square a distance of 100 links; thence again in a southeasterly direction along other part of the said Martin Square a distance of 150 links: thence again in a south-westerly direction along other part of Martin Square a distance of 150 links; thence again in a south-easterly direction, a distance of 100 links, to the commencing-point: be all the aforesaid measurements and each of them a little more or less.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land, containing by admeasurement 1 acre 2 roods 16 perches, being part of the land known as Martin Square shown in deposited plan No. 248 in the office of the District Land Registrar, at Wellington, commencing at a point 100 links distant in a north-easterly direction from the north-eastern corner of Section 366 on the plan of the Town of Martinborough; running thence along other part of the said Martin Square in a south-easterly direction a distance of 84 links; thence in a north-easterly direction a distance of 75 links; thence again in a north-easterly direction a distance of 290 links; thence in a north-westerly direction a distance of 301 links; thence in a south-westerly direction a distance of 70 links; thence again in a south-westerly direction a distance of 290.5 links; thence in a south-easterly direction a distance of 70 links; thence again in a south-easterly direction a distance of 70 links; thence again in a south-easterly direction a distance of 216 links, to the commencing-point: be all the aforesaid measurements and each of them a little more or less.
